

One more possibility

Last week Strategy Note 322 said we have one more possibility than the exchange-dependent systems that currently compete for dominance. A few weeks before, Strategy Notes 319 and 320 sketched aspects of that possibility.

This ancient option gets a recent mention in the scripture of one of the newer religions. Christian scripture (Acts 2:44-45 and 4:32-35) says that the early believers pooled their belongings and did not use property "rights" against each other.

I disagree with much of what gets advocated in the name of Christianity, but there they had a good practice. They just kept it too small, limiting it to their little in-group. We should do it on a humanity-wide scale.

Let's each do the work we can and want to do, make the fruits of our labor freely available to everyone, take turns doing the work we agree needs doing but not enough people want to do, and sort out the details through discussion.

Such a solidarity economy avoids exchange and its problems: inequality, poverty, oppression, oligarchy, autocracy, etc. Plus it fits well with the ways we humans generally treat each other in our closest relationships.

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
